NOTES IN CONNECTION WITH "ANY RIFLE" COMPETITIONS 2007

1. The definition of "Any Rifle" contained in NRA Rule 163 in the "Bisley Bible", reads:

Any Rifle — Match Rifle

163. Any single barrelled rifle complying with the Range Safety Regulations which must be fired in the positions permitted for MR or TR competitions (see Paras 242(a), 243 and 244) and complying with the following conditions:

<i>Weight.</i>	Unlimited.
<i>Pull of trigger.</i>	Minimum 0.5 kg.
<i>Muzzle Brakes.</i>	Prohibited.
<i>Ammunition.</i>	Any suitable for use in that particular rifle (see Paras. 289, 290, 291 and 544 and Appendix 14).

2. As noted, Paras 242 (a), 243 and 244 also apply, and these read as follows:

242. (a) *Prone.* — The butt plate of the rifle must be placed against the shoulder or armpit and all parts of the rifle and sling and of the arms below the elbow, including clothing, must be visibly clear of the ground and of all other objects except when firing Match Rifle or the self-loading or cadet GP rifles (see Paras. 244 and 245) or if firing in F Class. In Target Rifle events the back of the forward wrist must be 100mm (4", approximately the width of this book) clear of the ground, as measured from the outside surface of a glove if worn. Elbows must be behind the line of number pegs.

243. Other than in F Class, no artificial rest or attachment for steadying the rifle or arm, other than the sling (see Para. 239), is allowed except when firing "from cover", which may be used as a rest (but see Paras. 244 and 245).

244. As an exception to Paras. 242(a) and 243, in Match Rifle or Any Rifle competitions a competitor may use a rest which **must not** touch the rifle, to support the forward hand or forearm. **The butt must not rest on the ground or a support of any kind.**

3. The ammunition safety limits for Bisley Ranges are contained in the Bisley Range Safety Regulations 2006, and the relevant sections state:

a. **All shooters are responsible for ensuring that their firearms and ammunition are safe to use.** All firearms and ammunition must be made available for inspection and testing whenever required. The regulations concerning dangerous ammunition are laid out in Appendix 14 to the Rules of Shooting, copies of which are available on request.

c. The use to which a range may be put is set by its safety certificate. The following firearms and/or calibres only may be used on individual ranges as in para 3 below, **but subject always to:**

- i. a maximum muzzle velocity of 3275 ft/sec (1000 m/sec), and
a maximum muzzle energy of 5160 ft. lbs (7000 Joules).

4. The competition conditions, and when they may be fired, are summarised overleaf. Please carefully study these notes, and the match conditions, before entering a particular competition.

5. It is strongly recommended that all competitors obtain a copy of the "Bisley Bible" and familiarise themselves with all NRA Rules and Regulations before entering any competition. **Please note that ignorance of a rule will not be accepted as an excuse under any circumstances.**
